We will thoughtfully express our ideas, hopes and concerns as a Pastor Search Committee comes into being and begins its work.

We will covenant with one another and with God to make this time of transition an opportunity for growth and spiritual development as we prepare for a new minister.

All in all we honor our history, bless and care for one another and gratefully cast God’s vision for the ministry of Westmoreland Congregational United Church of Christ into the decades ahead.

The above covenant was recited by all Westmorelanders present in the worship service on June 12.

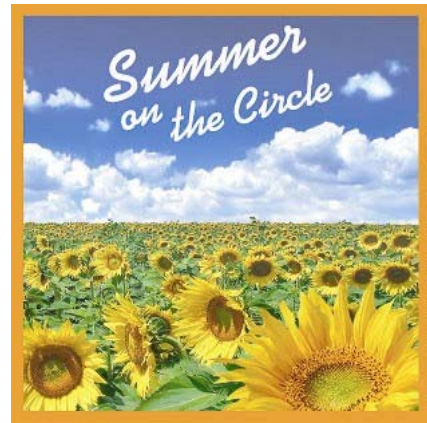

As we enter our time of transition to a new Senior Minister, I want to take time to let you know of some of the efforts that your church leaders and staff are making to prepare for the future.

Our New Pastoral Transition Web Page

Thanks to Tim Waidmann, our Webmaster, for creating a brand new section of the Westmoreland website to share information and updates about our transition and future efforts to seek and receive our new Senior Minister. The web page, entitled **Pastoral Transition: Our Shared Path Forward**, is designed to include a variety of information that will evolve and expand to keep you informed of transition related activities and actions. For now the page includes our shared "Covenant For The Journey" that was entered into by the congregation on June 13 and copies of my letters to the congregation regarding the transition. Plans for Our Interim Summer Operations

Below is a message I sent recently to our professional staff thanking them for their continuing dedication and advising them of decisions of leadership about our church's summer interim operations.

Dear Bob, Jessica, Alejandro, Janet, and Sanelma,

On behalf of the Westmoreland Congregation as a whole, let me thank you for your continued dedication to and support of Westmoreland as we go through this time of transition. Already, in these last few weeks, you have shown your continuing high level of commitment to our life together and we deeply appreciate it. Allow me to take this opportunity to clarify the understanding of the Executive Committee on our common path forward.

Although various committees are still working on recommendations for how to handle our transition over the next year or so, I and the Executive Committee, are in full support of your plans to conduct church operations over the summer, through September 12, Welcome Back Sunday. We have full confidence in Bob's leadership and in all of you continuing

do your jobs as you do now. This means that Jessica and Alejandro will continue to participate in Sunday worship, and work under Bob's guidance to carry out all other church activities. Janet will continue her outreach and membership development activities and Sanelma will continue to manage the office. Bob will coordinate your efforts to ensure that all of Rich's tasks, including pastoral counseling and care, will be covered by our existing staff or with the help of outside assistance. The Executive Committee and I commit to support you with outside assistance as necessary to maintain our church's ministry throughout the summer.

After Rich's last day on June 6, Bob will assume supervisory responsibility for all church staff members and day-to-day church operations. For other staff members, though it is not anticipated that the time you commit to the church will change, it is possible that some shifting of your role and responsibilities, under Bob's direction, may be required to fully meet the needs of our congregation over the summer. As Moderator, I will stay in regular contact with Bob through phone, email and meetings. Staff members should continue to report to the Executive Committee at its regular meetings and coordinate with church leaders as you do now.

Looking to the future, I apologize for the delay in establishing procedures for the conduct of church operations following the summer. I know the uncertainty is difficult. Given the importance of this decision, church leaders are appropriately taking the time to research and consider all options to determine what is best for Westmoreland. I assure you that I will keep you informed of our progress on decisions about interim church operations after September 12. If any future decision contemplates changes in your roles and responsibilities, appropriate church leaders and I commit to meet with you in a timely manner to discuss the changes and how they can best be implemented to meet both yours' and the church's needs.

I am grateful for your patience with us and with this process and hope it will be only a matter of a few weeks before we have greater clarity on how to organize our work together for the fall and beyond. Each of you should please feel free to contact me at any time with any of your cares, concerns, or questions.

In a few weeks you will receive a letter from Westmoreland's Music and Arts Committee, describing the 2010-2011 Concert and Art Show Series and asking for your help. We are grateful for your past generous support of this series through your attendance, your donations each fall, and your participation in last winter's celebration, "Lena Seikaly, An Evening of Jazz". We need your help again this year so that this wonderful series can continue.

Our series is truly special. Four evenings each year Westmoreland invites everyone into our church for a concert, an art show opening, and a reception. Free, with no tickets or reservations required, all may enjoy the music, the art and fellowship. For each event, we invite a community service provider to join us, and offer the audience the opportunity to learn about and support the work of that organization. For 2010-2011, those agencies will again be: Shaw Community Ministry, Montgomery County Chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, Marie Reed School Programs, and Bethesda Cares. From our 2009-2010 series, we gave a total of \$3643 in free-will offerings to these four beneficiaries.

"The Arts encourage us to reach out and build community. They enhance communication and sharing with others as we concentrate on the discipline and hard work of preparation, and participate in the enriching cycle of giving and receiving."

These words, the last two sentences of the *Mission of the Arts at Westmoreland*, written in 1997, and posted on the bulletin board in the social hall, describe the spirit motivating our Concert and Art Show Series. You know that in order to offer this series, we need the time and effort of exceptionally talented musicians and artists in our community, we need committee members and others to help with planning, publicity and hosting of these evenings, and we need donations to cover the expenses of the series.
